ALTRINCHAM

The line terminates at Altrincham Interchange where Metrolink meets the national rail network & local and regional bus services. As a major town. Altrincham offers the pub lover a destination in itself. We list a selection within easy walking distance of the Interchange.

1. Barringtons Hotel, 2 Barrington Road

Free house & hotel a short walk from Altrincham Interchange, Main cafe-bar to front, also rear bar with fixed seating & low level lighting, Holt's Bitter.

2. Bricklavers Arms, 68 George Street

Traditional pub on pedestrianised street with garden to front, Wells & Young's Bombardier, Copper Dragon Golden Pippin and a quest ale feature. Meals served lunchtimes.

3. Costellos, 18 Goose Green

Dunham Massey Brewing Company's only pub, Modern bar located in secluded square just off the main shopping area. Serves six Dunham Massey's cask ales, plus their own Altrincham Pilsner.



4. Brewhouse, 18 Shaws Road

Specialist beer bar set over two floors and selling beers from Sweden, Germany, Belgium, USA, Holland and of course, the UK. At least one cask ale from Red Willow brewery always available plust one quest cask ale. Bar food in form of PieMinster pies with mash.

5. Malt Shovels, 68 Stamford Street

One of Altrincham's oldest pubs dating back to the Victorian era. The Sam Smiths Old Brewery Bitter is easily the cheapest ale in town with a good selection of other styles available on draft or in bottles.

6. Orange Tree, 15 Old Market Place

Multi roomed pub with garden to the rear and seating on Altrincham's Old Market Place to the front. Copper Dragon Golden Pippin, usually Caledonian Deuchers IPA & one guest beer are served. Meals served until 8pm. Sky Sports.

7. Old Market Tavern. Old Market Place

Long established favourite for cask drinkers with 11 ales available at

Historic pub moved to it's current location in 1837. Multiple rooms inside and large outside area including a marguee that features regular live music in summer months. Good home cooked food.

No.1: CITY - ALTRINCHAM

This guide contains brief details of pubs adjacent to or within easy walking distance of stations on the Manchester -Altrincham line from Deansgate on the outskirts of the city centre to the line's terminus at the historic market town of Altrincham. There are a mixture of traditional pubs & modern bars, most serving traditional cask conditioned ale.

The Knott, 374 Deansgate, M3 4LY



Exit the station via the Deansgate exit. The Knott is under the railway arch on far side of junction.

Greater Manchester Pub Of The Year 2010 & twice local pub of the year. Marble Manchester Bitter & Marble Ginger plus ever changing selection of 4 guest ales, an extensive range of foreign beers on draft & in bottles and real draft cider. Meals served until 8pm daily with all food cooked fresh to order.

The Tollgate, 48 Seymour Grove, M16 0LN

Directly opposite the station.

Large Marstons pub with outdoor drinking area. Popular with Manchester United fans visiting nearby Old Trafford. Meals served lunchtimes. No Cask Ale.

Robin Hood, 125 Barton Road, M32 9AF

Exit to street level and turn right. Cross Chester Road via subway onto Kingsway and pass Stretford Mall on your left. Pub is on next junction (0.4 mi)

Large pub with central bar. Has sold cask ale in past. Handpump remains but no ale has been sold for some time (at time of going to press).

Kings Ransom, Britannia Road, M33 2AB

Directly opposite station.

Greene King pub that serves range of guest ales alongside Greene King brands. Balcony & garden overlooking Bridgewater Canal. Meals served all day.



The Steamhouse, 1 Northenden Road, M33 2DH



Turn right out of station. Steamhouse is on corner on opposite side of street

Small bar on two levels. Four cask ales from Dunham Massey Brewery & Hydes but specialises in Belgian and other foreign beers. Over 25s only. Opens at 3.30pm daily. Live music at weekends.

JP Joule, 2A Northenden Road, M33 3BR

Turn right out of station. JP Joule is 100 yards on your right.

JD Wetherspoon pub on two levels. Typically five or six guest cask ales in addition to Wetherspoon standard offerings. Meals served all day.



The Old Packet House, 1 Navigation Road, WA14 1LW The Navigation, 122 Manchester Road, WA14 4PY

Exit station and turn right at end of platform. Follow road for approximately 0.4miles. Pubs are opposite each other at end of road.

The Old Packet House is a historic pub with mock tudor frontage. Cask ales are Tim Taylors Golden Best,

Boddingtons and one guest usually from Hydes. Part covered yard to rear. Meals lunchtimes & evenings.



The Navigation is part of The Sizzling Pub Co chain with offers on a variety of value meals. Cask ale from Thwaites of Blackburn

The Deansgate, Deansgate, M3 4LQ

Exit the station via the Deansgate exit. At junction turn right. The Deansgate is under the tram line on the right.

Large multiroom pub. Up to four cask ales from Thwaites, Moorhouses & guests. Rooftop drinking garden. Food served all day.



Pomona Palace, Cornbrook Road, M15 4WB

Exit down to street level and turn left & left again. Pub is 50 yards along.

One of very few traditional pubs to survive nested between housing estates & industrial units in this much redeveloped area. No cask ale.

Bishop Blaize, 708 Chester Road, M32 0SF



Exit the station on the Manchester bound side. Walk up Warwick Road past cricket ground and continue over A5014 Talbot Road. At next junction pub is on opposte side of junction to the left.

Good range of cask ales including LocAle. Food until 10pm daily. Very busy on Manchester United match days.

The Bridge Inn, Dane Road, M33 7QH

Exit station to street level. Turn left. The Bridge Inn is just over the canal.

JW Lees pub adjacent to Bridgewater Canal. Three cask ales from Lees. Extensive waterside patio. Meals served all day.



The Brook, Station Approach, Brooklands Road, M33 3SQ



Accessed via platform level side exit from Southbound platform.

Small JW Lees pub. JW Lees Bitter. Refurbished late 2011 adding a large outdoor area. Popular for TV Sports, especially Sale Sharks Rugby. Meals lunchtimes only.

Timperley Taverners Club, 43A Park Road, WA14 5AD

Exit station and turn right. Cross canal and continue 50 yards. Club is below road level on right.

Private members club open evenings from 7.00pm. Show CAMRA membership card or this guide to be signed in as guest. Two or three cask ales from Hydes with occassional guests. Real cider.



Moss Trooper, Moss Lane, WA15 6JU



Exit station and turn left. After 0.3 miles turn right onto Moss Lane. Pub is 0.2 miles on right over railway bridge.

Large JW Lees pub with central bar surronded by seating on 4 sides. Typically four cask ales from Lees range. Good value meals served all day
